Parking meeting

Thank you to the 13 staff and parents who attended the meeting and the 6 parents who emailed in suggestions and support.

It was clear that, although there where frustrations on both sides, there is a lot of goodwill, ideas and support for moving the parking situation forward.

Ideas raised;

- 1. That the library could be opened early and staffed by parents for parents and children that use public transport but have to get to school early
- 2. A clear plan for parking and drop off areas in West Garth Road
- 3. Could the council change the time of the parking restrictions in West Garth Road?
- 4. Could we have 30 mins to drop off rather than 20 mins?
- 5. Approaching outlying village halls to see if we can use their car park as a park and ride for festivals
- 6. Approaching local residents to see if we can use their drive for parking we pay them a fee
- 7. Suggest we move the plan forward in stages
- 8. As a start, can we create a safe zone for crossing outside the school lane on West Garth Road using cones on both sides of the road. Since the meeting Alice has approached the council/police about placing cones in West Garth Road
- 9. A working party to look at all suggestions. This group would then communicate with the travel plan group. Francis is happy to chair this group
- 10. We need to create a culture around parking and communicate it continually to parents.
